# TO YOUR HEALTH A HEALTH MINISTRIES ARTICLE BY MARK TYLER

Your health, physically, mentally, and spiritually, should be one of your primary concerns, in my opinion, if it is not, I would suggest that you prioritize and make it so. There are aspects of our health that are preordained (ie. Hair and eye color, adult weight, etc.). These are genetic and are, for the most part, predetermined and cannot be altered. However, there are many, many choice we can make that can make that can have a profound effect on our health. If we choose wisely, the rewards can and will be returned many times over.

Be the best role model that you can be! As adults we can influence, in great measure, successful health patterns for our children and they will recognize the effort and will be successful in their own right. The conversation cannot be confrontational, in my opinion, but expressed as a learning experience. It could be initiated with "It is because I love you and care deeply for you that we need to talk about..." It has to be, and should be, a discussion of pros and cons that is meaningful to both parties. Take time to make it happen!

Nicotine addiction, in whatever form, has negative consequences for the quality of our lives and our longevity, even in secondhand smoke. The same could be stated for excessive alcohol use and abuse as well as illegal drugs. Obesity can be just as detrimental to our health and existence as alcohol, nicotine, and drugs. We function best when we are able to maintain those parameters (ie. Ideal weight). Obesity can lead to and influence greatly hypertension, diabetes, lung problems and can accelerate degenerative arthritis, and many, many more co-morbid conditions. The vast majority of excess weight is because we have not controlled our caloric intake for whatever reason.

We should also maintained or initiate regular physical activity. You can dedicate yourself to a routine that fits you and your lifestyle and can be done year-round in some shape or form. The rewards can be tremendous. If you can maintain or lose weight your heart rate will be slower, your blood pressure will be lower, your blood sugars will improve (if diabetic) and you will feel better about yourself and your sleep will be more restful and refreshing as well. I believe too, but that your emotional well-being and interactions with loved ones and others will improve over time and be that much more rewarding for all concerned.

Dedicate yourselves to a new beginning! Our 'Walk to Jerusalem' was a great start, but keep it going! I believe that your "payback" physically, mentally and spiritually will reward not only you but your loved ones as well. You are always in my prayers and I hope you make the choice that is right for you and your family!

#### STEWARDSHIP=REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

Good news!! As I am sure you read in your water bill, Cedar Rapids is hosting another set of drop-off sites for unusual items to be recycled. You must have the bright red Clean Up CR ticket that was in your bill to participate, but if you did not get one, I would assume you can get another at <a href="https://www.CleanUpCR.com">www.CleanUpCR.com</a>. The Large Item Drop-off is Sat., May 12 9:00-2:00 at 2250 A Street SW (the Solid Waste Agency location near Czech Village and Mt. Trashmore). You may take appliances (\$4.50 each), furniture or other large household items, clothing for Salvation Army, wood waste, home electronics, scrap metal, tires. So now is the time to take those old speakers, computer parts, old cords, CD players, etc. so all the toxic material can be recycled correctly.

There will also be a Household Hazardous Materials drop-off on Sat., May 19 9:00-2:00 at the same site. You may take aerosol cans, automotive fluids, garden pesticides and herbicides, household cleaning products, oil-based paint (NOT latex), stains and thinners, solvents and varnishes. Last fall they held the same type of event and gathered tons of material to be recycled or properly disposed. Thank goodness they are doing it again! Please support their efforts and dispose of your extraneous material properly.

Remember that, with planting season swiftly approaching, that all garden pots cannot be put into the Curby, even though they have a recycling number on them. I know that Culver's Nursery outside Marion will take them, plus all bags that potting soil, mulch, etc. come in. Just walk around to the back of the main building and find the recycling bins. At one time Lowe's also took the pots. I don't know if they still do, but it is worth a try!

Happy Spring Cleaning! We are needed to take care of God's creation.

#### GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE

April 6<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. our Chancel Choir and Pastor Katie will present a Tenebrae service in the Sanctuary. This Service of Darkness commemorates the suffering and death of Christ, and is based on the ancient Tenebrae. Dating from the 8<sup>th</sup> Century, Tenebrae was originally celebrated on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of Holy Week. It represented the darkness that fell over the earth as the Son of God was crucified. The Candles symbolize Christ, who is our Light and the Light of the World. They are used as impressive ceremonies at Christmas time symbolizing the coming of the Light. The use of candlelight in a darkened church on Good Friday portrays the fading light of the world as Christ was dying and leaving it. You will experience seven readings from scripture and beautiful musical offerings designed for this Service of Darkness and based on the Seven Last sayings of Christ from the Cross. The glow from the last vigil candle indicates that death only seems to triumph over Christ, and points toward the coming Resurrection.


