From the Pastor's Desk...

Admittedly, when someone says March, usually the first word that comes to my mind is "Madness." This of course refers to the Men's and Women's NCAA Basketball Tournament. As the tournaments approach, people begin predicting what "seed" teams will be; of course, those making the top seeds have a somewhat prestigious place to begin the tournament. Those that are on the "bubble" as the teams are being chosen, are the ones which are most nervous. "Will we get in or not?" is the penetrating question that has them on the edge of their seat.

The Selection Committee looks at all sorts of factors to make the decision of who gets in and who will remain at home to watch the tournament rather than participate. It involves such things as record, strength of schedule, what rated teams they played, and perhaps beat and the list goes on. These factors "earn" their right to be in the tournament.

What if this was how people were chosen to get in to heaven? Life would be a constant attempt of trying to calculate if we had earned enough to enter the Pearly Gates. How agonizing that would be!

These thoughts brought me back to a time several years ago. I still visualize years ago a lunch I had with a person I greatly appreciated: one of my doctors who happened to be Muslim. He knew that I was a Christian pastor, and when I had my regular appointments with him, he usually spent the largest percentage of our time asking me questions about what I believed, and comparing them to his own beliefs.

I invited him to lunch to hear the story of his faith journey. I listened intently as he shared. Toward the end of our time, I asked him what enabled a person in the Muslim faith to be "saved," as he hadn't bridged the subject thus far. He guickly held his hands up, one much higher than the other, intending it to appear like a scales. "It is if your good outweighs your bad," he explained. "Wow!", I though

ht, I'm glad that is not what determines how we understand salvation. There are many verses in scripture that point to the criteria:

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes on him shall not die, but have everlasting life." John 3:16

"For it is by grace that you have been saved, through faith---and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God---not of works, so that no one can boast." Ephesians 2:8-9


L&F LAUNCHES UNDIES SUNDAYS FOR MOTHER'S DAY!

BEACON OF LIGHT SHINES


