Holy Week-Westminster Style



The Gift of Prayer

I have been impressed with the ministry of the His Hands Free Clinic since I arrived in Cedar Rapids four years ago. I remember visiting for the first time when the clinic was located on the corner of 12th St. and 4th Avenue. I was amazed at the breadth of services they offered, though the space was limited. One of the areas that was offered was prayer for each patient. I was asked to consider being a prayer partner, but having just arrived I was hesitant to commit at that time. I continued to contemplate this opportunity, but never decided to commit.

When they made the move to the current location at 1245 2nd Ave. SE, I went to the open house. I was amazed at the growth of both space and services. Again, the opportunity to be a prayer partner presented itself. I still did not sign up.

Then a month ago, pastors were invited to a time of prayer. I decided to attend. I finally felt the timing was right, and after returning to my office, I went online to fill out an application. After, clearing the background check, taking the training necessary, and job shadowing, I then took my first shift (a morning one). We began the day with prayer with the entire staff, and then went to our respective places.

At the appropriate time I would go into the room and ask the patient how I might pray for them. Some do not wish to have prayer, but most appreciate it. After offering prayer we offer a Bible in their own language, a devotional, and a paper with the names of numerous churches available. (Yes, Westminster is on it). What a blessing to be able to be involved in this ministry. I thoroughly enjoy serving at Loaves and Fishes, but because it receives government commodities, no mention of Christ or invitations to church are allowed. Perhaps God might be calling you to volunteer.

Stories From Loaves & Fishes

Over this last year we came to realize what a large percentage of our food pantry clients have food restrictions or special needs. These needs range from medical conditions, lack of teeth, and limited or no cooking facilities (which often means they are homeless). In an effort to meet some of these needs, so clients can make use of the food we are offering, L & F from time to time offers our clients cooking utensils, storage containers, dishes, and pots and pans. We also occasionally have some towels or bedding to offer them as well. Sometimes we are able to offer personal care items such as shampoo, toothpaste, soap, laundry detergent or other cleaning supplies. Once in a while we get a glimpse of how these offerings can make a difference for someone. We were able to provide one gentleman, who did not have a means to cook but was not homeless, with a George Foreman Lean Mean Grilling Machine. When he is offered some kind of meat he always asks "Can I cook this in my George Foreman Lean Mean Cooking Machine?" He is very proud of that machine!
